Examination on hard surface

Straight line: Horse is sound in walk and trot.
Circle: Horse is sound on both reins

Flexion tests:

LF-RF-LH-RH LF RF LH RH Horse does not respond to 1 minute of bending, no lameness was observed.

Examination on soft surface

Walk: no abnormalities
Trot: no abnormalities. Nice functional trot
Canter: no abnormalities. Horse canters well balanced with enough power

Respiratory sounds while lunging: No abnormalities heard

Neurologic impression: Horse shows no signs of abnormalities of innervation of the front- and/or hindlimbs.

Additional examinations Endoscopy: Not performed

Under Saddle Not performed
