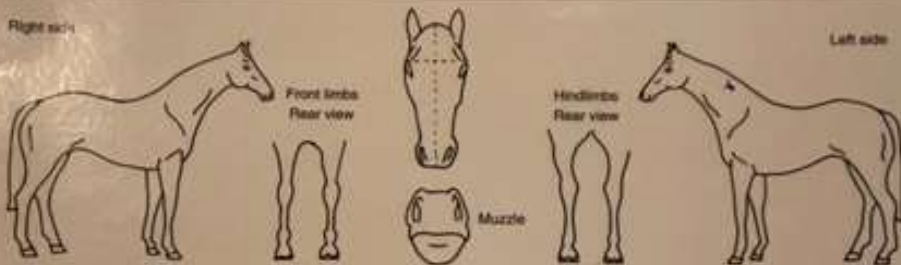

 6.
