

Special Examinations:

Clinical Examination;

The 5-year-old mare presented for the above examination was in overall good body condition and was of a quiet and calm disposition. The dentition, microchip number and markings documented within the passport correlated with the mare presented to me. Routine cardiovascular, respiratory and ophthalmic examinations were all within reference ranges. The mare was negative to hoof compression tests of all four feet; farriery was deemed adequate for conformation. Shod with steel fullered concave shoes, unshod behind.

Timed 60 second flexion tests of all four limbs were negative. The mare demonstrated balanced and equal gaits of walk, trot and canter whilst being lunged. No audible respiratory noise made at gallop. Post exercise cardiovascular auscultation was normal. Post exercise flexion tests were within normal limits.

Neurological Testing;

In depth neurological examination undertaken to incorporate cervical range of motion, proprioception testing, tight circling, and rein back; no abnormalities detected.
