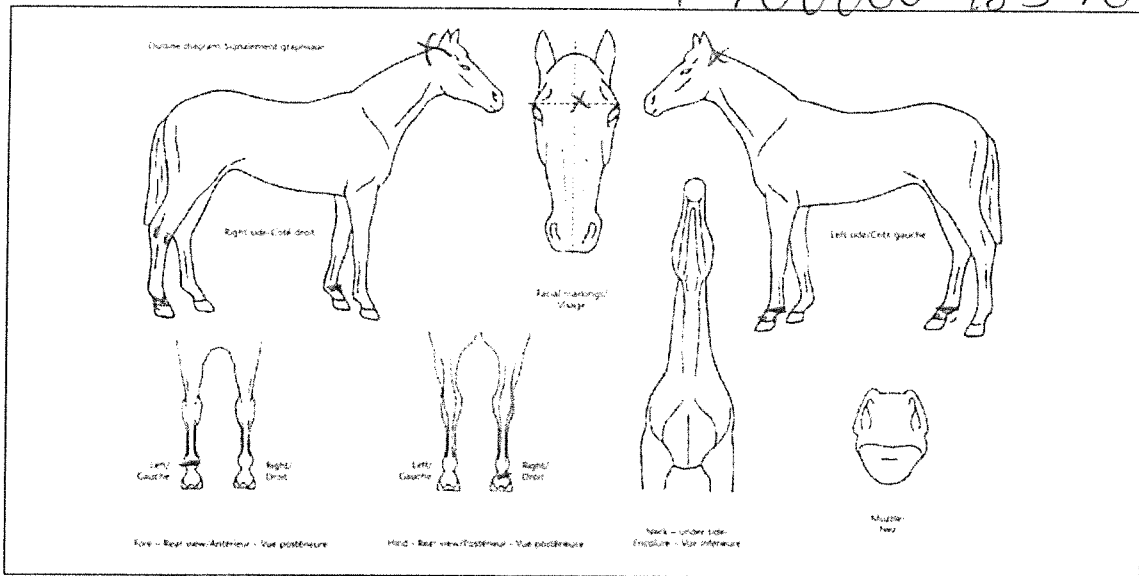

General instructions regarding the pre-purchase / pre-sale examination

Contract-Nr.

You herewith contract the services of " Dr. Martin Hinrichsen - Tierärztliche Praxis für Pferde " for a pre-purchase examination/pre-sale examination of a horse.

Please read all the pages of this pre-purchase/presale examination contract and its supplementary information carefully. Should you have any questions regarding the contents/sequence, feel free to contact the equine practice. Please understand that we can only start with the examination after your answers to all items of the following pages have come to hand. You may use facsimile transmission, e-mail for your answers or hand them over before the beginning of the examination. Unfortunately, the statutory revised version of the law on the international sale of goods and the law of obligations within the Code of Civil Law (BGB) and the terms imposed by the third party liability insurance companies require greater administrative effort and expense in connection with the pre-purchase/presale examinations of horses. Please understand the proceeding, which at first glance seems to be more complex and costly, in view of the pre-purchase/pre-sale examination to be performed by us. These new provisions have been introduced by legislation for your protection during the purchase of a horse and have to be observed by us.

You should have received a total of 7 pages (including the cover page and these general instructions), which have been split up as follows:

- I. General Contract Terms
- II. Declaration of Seller
- III. Declaration of Client
- IV. Definition of the Scope of Examination

Copyright advice: The copyright for all subsequent texts are held by „Dr. Martin Hinrichsen - Tierärztliche Praxis für Pferde “. Any further form of exploitation shall require the express approval by the owner of the rights.

I. General Contract Terms

1) The subsequent General Contract Terms shall apply to all pre-purchase/pre-sale examination contracts between " Dr. Martin Hinrichsen - Tierärztliche Praxis für Pferde " (hereinafter: veterinary surgeon) and individuals or legal entities (hereinafter: client).

The pre-purchase/pre-sale examination serves for assessing the current state of health of a horse, targeted at collecting diagnostic findings that may have an effect on the purchase decision. The examination always represents a diagnostic instant photo. Statements about the development of individual findings cannot be made. The result of the examination does not qualify the horse as healthy or not healthy nor does it assign any grades to its state of health.

2) Regarding the place of the examination, the following requirements shall be met:

- calm and trouble-free environment
- well illuminated place of examination
- a room which permits a high degree of darkening for an examination of the eyes
- a show track of uniform flatness and hardness and of at least 30 m length
- a circle of uniform hardness of 10 to 15 m diameter
- a lunging or riding square with soft ground

3) The clinical pre-purchase/pre-sale examination proper shall be defined in detail by the client on basis of the selection to be performed in subsection IV of the present contract. This corresponds to the examination standard established, which represents a practicable compromise between diagnostic effort and financial expenditure. Additional examinations will widen the range of diagnostic options. They involve additional effort and expense, and the client, after consultation with the veterinary surgeon, will decide in the individual case if and by which special examinations the standard program should be enlarged.

4) The veterinary surgeon is not obliged to outline the risks related to the individual steps of the investigation unless the examination goes beyond the scope defined by the client in subsection IV, in particular with regard to the examination at a trot on the pavement, on the circle and the flexion tests to be performed. The veterinary surgeon is entitled to sedate the horse for the examination as the case may be. After having obtained the owner's consent,

the client shall give the permission that the examinations defined and desired by him shall be carried out.

5) The veterinary surgeon undertakes not to disclose to third parties the findings obtained in connection with the examination. He shall have the right to provide information to the owner and / or buyer / seller of the horse, unless he is the client, if the client gives his express permission to do so. The examination report is exclusively intended for providing information to the client. Any delivery of the report to third parties shall be permitted only subject to the veterinary surgeon's approval, and this shall be expressly stated by the client in subsection III.

6) The valuation of the findings obtained shall be performed to the best knowledge and belief of the veterinary surgeon and reflects his personal opinion. No forecast can be made regarding the future development of individual findings, of the state of health, the fitness for use and the serviceability of the horse.

7) The results of the pre-purchase/pre-sale examination can only be correct if the horse has not been exposed to the effects of medication. In order to exclude this and to protect all parties involved in this respect, blood samples can be taken for the laboratory analysis of a possible medication for every pre-purchase/pre-sale examination. The client shall decide whether the blood sample shall be tested immediately or stored during 6 months for a possible problem case.

8) As regards environment- or season-dependent diseases or changes, the pre-purchase/pre-sale examination cannot provide any final statement. This applies specifically to behaviour peculiarities such as e.g. cribbing and weaving, to chronic bronchitis caused by stable raising, for special diseases of the upper respiratory tracts occurring when exposed to heavy strain, as well as for allergies, summer eczema and periodic eye diseases.

9) After obtaining a serious finding, the pre-purchase/pre-sale examination will, as a rule, be stopped and/or it will be agreed between the owner and/or client and the veterinary surgeon that further special diagnostic steps have to

be initiated for further clarification. In the event of an acute disease, the pre-purchase/pre-sale examination may be postponed until complete recovery.

10) When requested, the interpretation of X-rays will be made according to the so-called X-Ray Guideline presently applying in Germany. Such X-Ray Guideline should enable the client to get an idea about the allocation of findings to a percentage risk category which should be as uniform as possible. The application of this Guideline is voluntary. It only refers to determined radiographs, and the resulting classification does not provide any information about the current serviceability or clinical quality of a horse. X-rays that are not described in the X-ray Guideline can therefore also not be classified according to it. In case that the client requests a radiological overall assessment, the maximum value obtained shall determine the allocation to a category. According to the 2007 version, it is well possible to deviate from the guideline specifications on the basis of one's own personal valuation, e.g. considering sport successes or in comparison with previous X-rays of the horse. However, the reasons for such deviation must be stated in writing.

Overview of classes:

Class I: No special radiological finding and findings which can be classified as anatomic shape variants (ideal state)

Class II: Findings which slightly deviate from the ideal state, for which the appearance of clinical phenomena within an indefinite period of time can be estimated with a frequency of less than 3% (normal state).

Class III: Findings deviating from the standard, for which the appearance of clinical phenomena within an indefinite period of time can be estimated with a frequency of 5 to 20% (acceptable state)

Class IV: Findings considerably deviating from the standard, for which clinical phenomena are probable (more than 50%) (risk state).

Intermediate classes: The subdivision into intermediate classes I to II, II to III and III to IV are intended to express that different appraisers may possibly arrive at different results according to the clarity of the findings and own experiences. No provision has been made for any further subdivision. The difference in percentages between Classes II, III and IV corresponds to the subdivision into the intermediate classes II to III and III to IV. The subdivision into X-ray classes is only related to the radiological findings (radiological assessment).

Any classification subsequent to surgery is made according to the current radiological findings.

Special attention is drawn to the fact that the veterinary surgeon interpreting the X-rays is performing the classification to the best of his knowledge and belief. Since an X-ray image is a two-dimensional reproduction of a three-dimensional body, and depending on the examination conditions, cooperation of the horse, positioning of the limbs or other conditions, no absolutely ortho-

grade reproduction can be guaranteed for the overview pictures made, differing interpretations of findings

may be possible by the overlapping of individual structures as the case may be. It is therefore recommended to produce several X-rays in different angles of projection. Furthermore, it is expressly stated that it may very well happen that different veterinarians, based on different experiences, may give the same findings different interpretations as regards their clinical relevance. In this context, the X-Ray Guideline is no directive but only a guideline. It is expressly declared that the opinion of a veterinary surgeon must not necessarily coincide with the opinion of any expert.

If so agreed in the contract, the veterinary surgeon owes the production and interpretation of X-rays. They are his property. He is not obliged to deliver them unless expressly otherwise agreed.

11) The liability of the veterinary surgeon is governed by the legal regulations. It refers merely to the relationship with the client and if applicable, to any third party named in the contract. Any liability towards other third parties shall be excluded.

Excluded shall be the liability of the veterinary surgeon for simple negligence with the exception of obligations the implementation of which makes the performance of this contract only possible at all and on the compliance with which the client may regularly rely. In these cases, the liability of the veterinary surgeon for the compensation of damages shall be limited in scope and amount to the substitution of the contractually foreseeable damage. A refunding of costs for keeping (costs of accommodation, feeding, attendance, riding, vet, horse shoeing) on the one side and a deduction of the benefits drawn on the other side, shall not take place. All claims of the client or of any third party included in the area of protection from the entire contract relationship shall become time-barred 1 year after the beginning of the statutory period of limitation, at the latest after the lapse of 5 years following the beginning of the examination.

12) Should any of the provisions of this contract be completely or partially ineffective, this shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions. The invalid provision shall be substituted by such provision as comes closest to the purpose of the invalid provision.

13) Irrespective of whether the examinations object of the present contract are performed within the territory of the Federal Republic of Germany or any other country, the contractual relationship shall be governed exclusively by the German law. This choice of law shall apply to all claims of the contracting parties. As far as possible, the place of jurisdiction for all disputes arising from this contract shall be agreed to be Flensburg.

If the seller himself has ordered the examination, but is not present during the investigation, he has to fill in the form personally while appointing and stating in this form a person with the authority of representation who will attend the examination. If the client is a minor, the signature of his/her legal representative must be on hand. The seller declares his consent to all the examinations to be performed during the pre-purchase examination.
